## Physical Therapy for Neurological Disorders...



**Neurological impairments can affect people of all ages and interfere with many areas of life. Physical Therapists are specially trained to help you regain or improve daily function and independence in the following areas:**

- Balance
- Coordination
- Endurance
- Ambulation (Walking)
- Movement/Range of Motion
- Strength (Weakness)
- Activities of daily living

## Occupational Therapy for Neurological Disorders....

**Occupational Therapists help people develop the ability to complete daily tasks related to their individual lifestyles and needs. Following a neurological event, an Occupational Therapist may...**

- **Recommend** equipment that can aid a person in completing tasks, such as dressing, bathing, and preparing meals.
- **Evaluate** the home for safety hazards and adapt the home by removing hazards that could cause further injury.
- **Provide** training that improves the ability to complete daily tasks.
- **Build** a person's physical endurance and strength.
- **Help** a person compensate for vision and memory loss.
- **Provide** activities that rebuild self-confidence and self-esteem.



## Speech-Language Therapy for Neurological Disorders...



**Speech-Language Pathologists evaluate and treat speech, language, cognitive-communication, and swallowing disorders across all ages. A speech-language pathologist may assess and treat the following areas of need for a person with a neurological disorder:**

- **Articulation** – pronouncing sounds to make words
- **Voice**
- **Fluency** – stuttering
- **Understanding** of spoken and written language
- **Expression** of thoughts and ideas
- **Word-Retrieval**
- **Memory**
- **Attention & Neglect**
- **Planning and organization**
- **Social skills**
- **Swallowing safety**
- **Alternative Communication**
